We are so happy to see our eagles back in the nest for another year of fun, learning, homework, field trips, friends—the list goes on and on. Thank you for always supporting our efforts here at school, by beginning your "school" routines at home. The transition from summer mode to school mode has gone very smoothly.

Please be sure to check out our website at edengardensmagnet.com. It is fabulous and very user friendly. What a wonderful way to introduce our school to inquiring perspective parents. We are going to begin putting more and more on the website, as we move toward becoming a "paperless" school. There will soon be a new feature called "Check Us Out" which will have several pieces of information about our school. I hope you will "check us out" when that portion is up and running.

With the return to school during the hot months of August and September, it is inevitable that we will have some inside days. If the temperature or heat index goes above 95 degrees, we will have an inside recess. We have been taking the children outside for a leisurely walk around the track the first fifteen minutes of recess, then classroom activities the second fifteen minutes of recess. This seems to be working well, with our students happy to get a little fresh air and sunshine, but also happy to come back into our cool building.

Traffic is going smoothly. Our fifth grade school patrol is assisting us in carpool again this year by opening doors and helping our kindergarten eagles find the way to their lines or classrooms. Please be reminded of the following:

- **School begins** with the ringing of a bell of the 7:45 bell. Students arriving after the tardy bell rings at 7:55 **must stop by the office and check in with the attendance clerk.** The Caddo Parish tardy policy can be found in our Parent/Student Handbook. We place a high priority on students being both at school and on time. We know you will help us with this policy. Of course, we know the beginning of school is very hectic with many traffic problems, so we are very flexible the first few days back!
- **Supervision of students begins with the 7:30 bell.** Please do not drop your children off before that time, as there is no one to supervise them.
- Please **do not "park and walk"** your child to the building, or drop them off in the neighborhood to walk. This is not only dangerous, but also impedes the smooth flow of traffic. I appreciate your cooperation, as we strive to keep every child safe, and a smoothly flowing carpool.

WE'VE GOT SOUND, YES WE DO! WE'VE GOT SOUND, HOW ABOUT YOU!!



With your generous monetary donations and cumulative recycling efforts, your Eden Gardens PTA was able to purchase a state-of-the-art sound system, designed and installed by Claiborne Sharp Professional Audio. Mr. Sharp said that the old system was probably original to the school and was a mail order DJ system sold in the 50s or 60s!

Included:

- Four new handheld/stand mics
- One wireless mic for a speaker to wear
- Two condenser mics for choirs
- All new high-tech mic stands which minimize feedback
- Six microphone jacks built into and on the sides of the stage
- New speakers in the front and back including a large "monitor" speaker for the performing groups to hear their music played back at them
- Reconfigured speaker design to maximize sound
- Locked, metal, mounted equipment rack and cabinet to house the equipment
- CD player
- New eight input audio mixer with inputs for all the mics and CD player
- New amplifier with five separate outputs for the different speakers
- Capability to easily shut off the cafeteria speakers
- Power conditioner designed to handle 1000s of surges
- All necessary cables, including connector for showing DVD's



PTA received over \$10,000 in dedicated cash donations from parents, the fifth grade class of 2010, and Girl Scout Troop 1203. The additional funding came from dollars raised through Box Tops and other recycling efforts. Although our "cafegymatorium" limits our sound capabilities, our Eagles and their families will absolutely love the improvements, allowing all to better hear our important assemblies, our grade level programs, and our melodious choir performances!

Counselor's Corner

When you ask kindergarten teachers what kind of student succeeds best in school, chances are they'll say, "A child who believes he can learn.... And one who is eager to get started." You can help build that positive attitude in your child.

Here are some suggestions:

- **Expect your child to succeed in school.** One study of children found that children work harder in school when their parents expect more, and less when their parents expect less.
- **Give your child challenges they can master.** Help them learn to climb the steps to the playground slide. Teach them to button their own clothing or open the car door by themselves in the carpool line. Each of these skills will boost their confidence. Be sure to praise them as each new challenge is met. Promote independence!
- **Let your child make choices.** If they're very young, it may mean letting them choose whether the sandwich is cut into squares or triangles. When they are older, you can say, "Do you want to have your bath first or pick up your toys?" When you offer a choice, you are letting them know you have confidence in them.
- **Hug your child and tell them you love them.** Your love will give them the confidence to go out into the world and succeed.

Whose Homework is this, Anyway!

You've seen your child stare blankly at his homework. Or maybe your youngster has a hard time settling down and getting started. You know that homework is an important part of learning, but how involved should you be? Too much concern may cause kids to depend too heavily on their parents. Too little concern may let academic problems go unnoticed.

Follow these tips – work together for study success – and avoid the question, "Whose homework is it anyway?"

What your child can do:

Homework improves grades, teaches study skills, and increases learning. That's why it's important for students to complete their homework. Here's how your child can get the job done.

Get Assignments: Remind your child that it's his job to write down assignments. He will need to copy them from the blackboard. We also have them available on teacher websites. He should bring home his assignments, including instructions and handouts, the day they are given.

Keep a routine: Encourage your child to begin homework at the same time each day to make learning a habit. What time is best? Possibilities include immediately after school or later in the evening when she's had a chance to relax and eat a snack. Together, decide on a time that's best for her. Just don't allow her to leave homework until bedtime.

Create a study area: Many kids work best in a special study area, like at a bedroom desk or the kitchen table. However, some children do better sprawling on the living room floor. Consider letting your child decide where he'll work – he's more likely to stay on task when he's comfortable. His work area should have adequate lighting and a stash of homework supplies, such as pens, pencils, paper, and a dictionary.

Make a plan: With your child, glance over her homework and help her come up with a study plan. Suggest that she tackle tougher or longer assignments first while she's fresh and alert. She should be able to follow most homework instructions without supervision, but let her know you're available if she needs you.

Increase concentration: Some children need calm surroundings to focus on homework. Others may study better at the kitchen table while you are cooking supper. But television is usually too much for anyone to ignore. Your youngster should keep the TV off during study time so this mind is tuned in to his homework.

Plan for long-term projects: Encourage your child to use a calendar to help her plan projects. Have her divide each project into steps and write them on the calendar. (She may need your help breaking the assignment into chunks and choosing deadlines.) Tip: Writing daily assignments, as well as long-term projects, on a calendar may help her stay on schedule.

What you can do:

The key is for you to stay involved and monitor your youngster's homework without doing it for her. Consider these suggestions:

- Ask about assignments
- Maintain a schedule
- Offer support
- Give reminders
- Check homework
- Provide praise
- Team with teachers

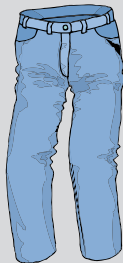

COORDINATOR'S COMMENTS

Welcome back to all of our eagle friends. We enjoyed our summer break and now we are really back in the swing of things. During the summer, Mrs. Wren, family, friends and parents continued to work diligently to brighten up our hallways. Terri Bianca has added her beautiful finishing touches to our 2nd and 3rd grade eagles. Prior to students reporting to school, Eden Gardens was buzzing with preparations. Teachers came early to create the beautiful learning environments that welcomed our students. Extra special items were purchased for the rooms using our welcome back funds provided by the PTA. We are so grateful to work with parents who support us in so many ways. We have been teaching and learning since day one.

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you, to the PTA for purchasing Vocabulary Workshop for our 3rd through 5th grade students. Thanks to Nancy Mitchell and your recycling efforts homeroom teachers have new pencil sharpeners to make life a little easier. Keep recycling! Every little bit helps.

Many forms of pretests are being done to help us establish curriculum that meets the individual needs of each student. The kindergarten teachers have been giving the Developing Skills Checklist (DSC) which assesses students' readiness skills in Language Arts, Mathematics and Motor Skills. All students, second through fifth grade, participated in STAR testing to help establish reading ZPDs. In September, all kindergarten through third grade students will be assessed using the Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) which is a state mandated assessment. DIBELS evaluates students' pre-reading and reading skills and all teachers have received training in providing interventions

to improve deficits in any of the assessed areas. DIBELS will be administered three times each year as required by the state of Louisiana. You will be notified only if there are concerns, but if you would like a copy of your child's results, please contact me at the school.

As you know, Caddo Parish has adopted a new information system called JPAMS. All teachers will use this system, but will also maintain their TeacherWeb pages because of the extra information provided for you there. Information put into JPAMS can be seen immediately by parents. This will greatly improve communication between the school and home. We look forward to the benefits of this program. It is, however, new to all of us. There are several things I want to ask you to do in order to help us continue to provide the best possible teaching and learning at every moment.

- Please wait to address grade concerns about posts on JPAMS until you have had a chance to review "Tuesday" folders and compare grades to papers.
- Keep in mind that while some multiple choice papers may be graded and posted on the same day, writings and constructed response items will take longer to grade.
- Remember that this system is new. We are still working out the kinks and will gladly correct any necessary information brought to our attention.

Finally, I want to share that I have already seen great things happening in the classrooms at Eden Gardens. The children are already reading novels, solving difficult math problems, comparing and contrasting cultures in small groups and doing science experiments. As always, it is a wonderful time to be learning in the Garden of Eden. If you have any specific questions regarding your child's academic progress, please call your child's teacher. If you have general curriculum and instruction questions, please do not hesitate to call me. My door is always open to you.

- **Car riders are dropped off and picked up in the back of the school every day.** We encourage you to “drop off” between 7:30-7:40, as traffic is very light at that time. We have about 250 cars that go through our loop daily, and we think we have the most efficient system to keep the traffic flowing. Traffic is always congested the first few days, but goes more smoothly once our new parents learn our “system.” **Please be patient!**
- **All car riders will be dismissed at 2:55 and will go directly to the cafeteria.** Sydney Allen will take your child’s name as you enter the car loop. It will help her if you will **write your child’s name or carpool names in big letters on a large card or piece of poster board and put it in your front window.** She will radio the cafeteria and your child’s name will be called over the bullhorn to report to the back of the school for car pickup. By the time your drive to the back, your child/carpool will be waiting. Please do not start to pull away until the last door is closed, then proceed slowly away from the curb. All car riders are to be picked up by 3:15.
- **Bus information is now available on-line.** Please come to the office for assistance.
- **Please communicate in writing** to your child’s teacher any transportation changes. This becomes even more important now that the Eden Gardens bus exchange has been moved to Caddo Middle Magnet. Your notes are sent to the office, to be signed by administrative personnel. **If a note is not received, we will follow what you indicated on your child’s enrollment form regarding transportation. Any transportation change by phone must be made before 2:30. Transportation requests made after that time cannot be approved.**
- **There will be no student checkouts between 2:30-2:55.** We also request that you not check your child out early unless an appointment has been made that **cannot** be arranged at any other time. Important instruction is missed each time your child

- is checked out of school. Please hold these to a minimum.
- **Please remember if you are on Eden Boulevard, stop and let one car in from Rainbow** as you travel through the carpool line. This helps us with the back-log of traffic on Line Avenue.
- **If your child has to take medicine during the school day,** you must have a “Request for Administration of Medicine to Student During School Hours”, on file in the school office. Medication cannot be administered to your child if these forms are not on file. The forms are available in the school office.
- **Students may not have any type of medication on their person, including cough drops.**

Mark your calendars for our annual **Back-To-School Skate Night** which has been tentatively scheduled for **September 14th**. It is always a fun time to meet new parents and visit with old friends. Please watch the Monday Memo for complete information. No homework will be given that night, so plan to come join our Eden Gardens family as we celebrate the beginning of another great school year.

Our **school carnival** is on the calendar for **Saturday, October 16th** from 11:00-3:00. It is a day that provides fun for our families and funds to support our many academic programs. The carnival committee is planning some new things this year, as well as continuing activities and games that are yearly favorites. **If you haven’t purchased a raffle ticket for the two reserved parking spaces for carnival, it’s not too late!** Just think how happy you will be if you are the name that is drawn! Bring your appetites, as our dads will again be grilling those famous hamburgers and hotdogs. Of course, we will also have pizza, nachos ...the list goes on and on.
